On behalf of all of us at Central School Project, I would like to express our sincere gratitude for the generous support we have received from the BAC over the past year. Please consider this form and attached materials as final reporting for the grant that was awarded to CSP in November 2014.

These funds were used for costs associated with our annual MAKE Youth Arts Festival. Final expenses for the Festival are below.

CSP has received **\$1500.00** from the BAC, which has been applied toward the above expenses. **\$1095.27** was received from other sources, designated for costs associated with this event.

Additional costs continue to be incurred by our ongoing Youth Arts Programming for this fiscal year. These are not included in the above budget, which only covers expenses directly associated with the MAKE Festival. Only cash expenses are included. The many hours of donated in-kind volunteer service, which are also critical to the success of the event, are not listed.

CSP successfully presented this year's MAKE festival despite the fact that the Tucson interactive theater company Stories That Soar! (STS) was unable to participate, due to their own financial constraints. (We do look forward to having them back next year.) For the past several Festivals, STS provided the culminating finale event, as well as leading 6 weeks of activities leading up to the Fest itself. We are proud that CSP was able to fill this void with other wonderful programming. This was due, in no small part, to the enlarged role played by our local collaborators in the LEAP organization. LEAP instructors provided activities of all kinds, and led youth performances throughout the day. We at CSP are very happy to have developed this collaboration over the past two years. (No funds pass between the two organizations, however.)

Attendance was down very slightly from past years. Generally MAKE Fest serves roughly 150 children, plus their parents and caregivers. This year our attendance was 142 children. We assumed that there would be drop-off in attendance, due to the fact that so many of the children in our school district usually participate in STS programs during the lead-up to the MAKE Festival. This longer-term engagement tends to serve as an incentive for them to come out to MAKE, at the end of their STS involvement. However, given the absence of STS in the Bisbee schools this year, we were surprised that this drop in attendance wasn't much more pronounced. In fact the number of participants who live within Bisbee was exactly the same as last year. We believe the relative consistency of the attendance from 2014 to 2015 is a testament to the popularity and community involvement with this event.

We did have significantly fewer children attend from communities outside of Bisbee. We intend to do more outreach next year to other areas of Cochise County, through increased postcard/poster distribution and increased Facebook ads.


