


MEDICARE ANNUAL ENROLLMENT OFFICE HOURS



THOUGHT CRIMINALS TAKE OVER CQ LIBRARY



The Pritchard Gallery is now showing the works of Steve Bovee and Paul Bovee. Steve is a longtime Bisbee resident and has worked for twenty years in the Forest Service, which has inspired his landscapes rendered in watercolors or oils. Steve is also a printmaker, book illustrator and playwright. Paul Bovee started painting regularly once he moved to Bisbee in 1980. He retired from teaching in 2006 and has focused on his art fulltime, inspired by the light and color of Southeast Arizona.

The Pritchard Gallery hosts quarterly art show from local Bisbee artists in the Copper Queen Library's Living Room. The Library sits in the heart of the Arts and Culture District of Bisbee and offers a large collection of art books and films, as well as hosting lectures, presentations, classes and workshops highlighting the unique range of arts and culture in the City of Bisbee.
