INTRODUCING THE LIBRARY TO BISBEE

The Library sponsors Community Field Trips throughout the year to introduce library patrons to some of the inner workings of our city. There is no transportation provided to the sites; participants are encouraged to carpool and meet at the destination.

CAMP NACO



Built in 1919, Camp Naco is located just 700 yards from the border with Naco, Arizona. It's immediate ancestor was a tent camp for soldiers stationed along the border beginning in late 1910, in response to the Mexican Revolution. Today, despite its recent hard times, the Camp's 21 buildings remain among the best preserved examples of architecture from the Mexican Border Defense Construction Project in the United States. All told, Camp Naco's near-century of institutional and community history along the U.S. Mexico Border and Bisbee make it a very special place, indeed.

WASTEWATER TREATMENT PLANT

The City of Bisbee's Wastewater Treatment Plant is a fascinating facility that uses biological processes to treat the city's wastewater. The Library initially did this tour as a part of our Summer Reading Program and was so popular with the kids, that we thought we would offer it as a Community Field Trip for everyone.

RECYCLING CENTER

The City of Bisbee's Recycling Station is a bustling processing center of incoming and outgoing recyclables picked up by the city and dropped off by residents. This tour shows how are recyclable materials are processed and where they go once they leave Bisbee.

FREEPORT MCMORAN

Our tours of Freeport property started with our Summer Reading Program and have now expanded to include our Community Field Trips. In the past, we have toured Freeport's Reclamation Projects and have even gone down into the pit to see a view of Bisbee not many have encountered!
