Project Description:

In 2014, The Bisbee Radio Project, Inc. (KBRP) created the Bisbee Blues Foundation to provide a long-term home for the Bisbee Blues Festival. As a 501c3 arts and culture-based non-profit, KBRP's mission-driven focus informed the goals and priorities applied to the future of the Bisbee Blues Festival.

The result of this strategic focus yielded Blues Village, an arts and education component to the festival. Blues Village is a free, daylong event that provides for artistic performance, workshops, and community collaboration.

Last year, Blues Village featured educator-led workshops in music history, performance, instrument-making, singing, songwriting, and recording. The event also included an exhibit featuring the art and photographs from previous Bisbee Blues Festivals and four local musical acts were invited to perform including The Sugar Thieves, Becky Reyes and Scott Muhleman, Dan Simonis, and Counter Clockwise. These educators and performers were compensated for their time through the sponsorship provided by the Bisbee Arts Commission.

Blues Village also collaborated with two outside organizations to provide additional public benefit. The Mexican Consulate in Douglas, Arizona worked together with KBRP to host the Naco Folklorico dancers in recognition of Mexican Independence Day on Tuesday, September 16th 2014. KBRP also partnered with LEAP (Learning Experiential Activities Programs) to make a wide array of musical instruments available for children to use during the event.

More than 300 individuals participated in the 2014 Bisbee Blues Village and all events during this arts and education day were made free and open to all. The intention was to create a family atmosphere where students from Bisbee and Cochise County were the beneficiaries. Based upon the first year success, KBRP is committed to continuing this event. The goal of Blues Village will be to provide for long-term community impact and provide a basis for future musical programming events and youth music education in Bisbee.

This year, KBRP hopes to expand upon this success at the 2nd Annual Bisbee Blues Village on Sunday, September 13th, 2015. The event will again feature workshops, performances, and community collaborations. The hope is to expand the focus of the event to increase attendance and participation.

While this is not a standard grant request as the Bisbee Arts Commission receives extensive promotion as an event sponsor, KBRP felt it was important to submit this proposal during the formal grant process in order to secure funding early and to make sure the request was given full consideration.

KBRP is requesting support for the 2015 Bisbee Blues Village in the amount of \$2,000, the amount awarded in 2014. KBRP is committed to increasing overall event sponsorship to expand upon the success in 2014. The Bisbee Arts Commission will be one of more than 15 individual and business sponsors, which will allow the event to diversify community support and provide for the financial support necessary to keep the event free and open to the public.

Community collaboration will again play an important role in the Bisbee Blues Village. KBRP hopes to include Cochise College, University of Arizona South, the Bisbee Unified School District, LEAP, the Boys and Girls Club of Bisbee, the Mexican Consulate, and Central School Project as project partners.

While the 2015 Bisbee Blues Village can certainly take place with reduced funding from the Bisbee Arts Commission, KBRP believes it is important to maintain an active relationship with the Commission as this project moves forward. As the organization that created the Bisbee Blues Festival, the Bisbee Arts Commission can continue to be involved as the event expands and evolves to serve a larger audience that is focused on the residents of Bisbee and Cochise County.







Project Description:

We are again requesting funding from the City of Bisbee Arts Commission to supplement the cost of bringing the Tucson Symphony Orchestra to Bisbee for their annual performance with the Bisbee Community Chorus. The concert will be held on March 7, 2016 at St Patrick's Parish in Old Bisbee. Attendance at this season's concert, held on November 6, 2014 was over 350, including approximately 40 students who were admitted free. Surveys were filled out by over 300 attendees, and their ethnic self-identification reflected the community's diversity. The majority of chorus members come from Bisbee, but they also come from Sierra Vista and the San Pedro and Sulfur Springs Valleys. The majority of audience members were also from Bisbee, but they came from as far away as British Columbia, Connecticut, and Mexico City.

The Symphony has come to Bisbee in a partnership with the Community Chorus for 17 years. We have received funding from Freeport-McMoRan, Arizona Public Service and the Bisbee Foundation to help defray the costs. With the assistance of TSO we will be applying for those grants again this year, but the Freeport-McMoRan grant will not be announced until February 2016 and most of expenses will have been incurred before then. We have also been informed by the Symphony that there may be an increase in their fee, which is currently \$9,000. Ticket sales at our November 2016 concert were \$5,085 though we anticipate some increase for the March concert next year given that we will have more time to publicize the event at our fall and holiday concerts. We are going to try to keep ticket prices at a maximum of \$20. We do not believe we can meet our goal of bringing music to the widest local audience possible if the ticket prices are increased. We will also continue to work with the public and private schools and homeschooled students in the area to give young people the opportunity to attend the afternoon concert at no cost.

I look forward to meeting with the Commission again and answering any questions you may have about the Chorus or about our partnership with the Tucson Symphony Orchestra.



Mission Statement

El Dia de los Muertos, Bisbee is a group of volunteers committed to celebrating this annual family-focused Mexican holiday, celebrated around the world, by promotion of community based art programs, performances, and cultural traditions.

It is our vision to see this holiday embraced, celebrated, and promoted by the Bisbee community at large. To expand over time in to different venues, performances, and various activities to take place in and around Bisbee during the month of October, culminating on November 1st and 2nd.

All proceeds go back to the community to support, and strengthen this agenda, as well as create new opportunities.

It is our desire to form long-term partnerships within the local community, and also with our neighbors across the border in Sonora, Mexico. Together we can enhance our cultural diversity and creative expression.

This merit based art funding request is submitted on behalf of the second annual **El Dia de los Muertos, Bisbee Art & Altarpiece Show**. The 2015 theme is **Día de los Inocentes** (Day of the Innocents), honoring the lives of dead children and infants. The project mission is to increase awareness of Dias de los Muertos through artistic interpretation, cross-cultural education, and community building. Bisbee's history, culture, and art has long been influenced by our Mexican neighbors. This project strengthens and enriches those relationships with a uniquely Bisbee community approach. This event is extended in the spirit of community growth through partnerships, celebration, conversation, contemplation, and education. Admission to the month long exhibition and fiesta/event is free, and family-friendly. There will be a nominal fee for workshops, and other fund-raising events. Workshop fees for children accompanied by a parent will be waived.

The November 1st festivities for Dia de los Muertos, are gaining in popularity on this side of the border, and attract large, diverse crowds eager to participate in the exhibit/event, which features local/regional visual and performing artists of all ages. This year the focus will be on the involvement of children and youth. This is a cultural immersion event that blends traditional roots with modern interpretations. The goal is to promote awareness of our community's multicultural roots, and to educate, through relevant programs, workshops and activities. The month long art display, celebration/fiesta event, various workshops, and use of the auditorium/building for performances are hosted by Central School Project (CSP), a 501 (c) (3) non profit organization, which is the fiscal sponsor of this event.

Art and Altarpieces are displayed at Central School Project from October 23rd through November 15 2015 (Weekends: Fri, Sat, Sun 11 - 4). The high point of the project is a family-friendly celebration event on November 1st, from 3 PM to 9 PM. This free to the public event will feature live youth performances (youth mariachi and folkloric dancing), Los Desconocidos and The Migrant Quilt Project, children's activities, a mercado, sugar-skull face painting, a traditional Mexican food truck, and construction of a community altar. Costumes are encouraged. Additional community activities planned in the months leading up to the event include various workshops (mini shrine/offrenda, paper flower, sugar-skull, mask making, etc), related film showings (Flor de Muertos), Bisbee merchant themed window displays, and Evergreen Cemetery grave maintenance.

The call for artist participation this year will include an open invitation to submit a event poster design. Artists of all ages are encouraged to submit their designs. Children are strongly encouraged to participate! There will be a \$200 award for the winning poster design (to be selected by the group committee), and the artist will also receive 50% of any profits made from the sale of poster prints during this years event.

Longtime artist/Bisbee resident Juliette Beaumont, will spearhead the 2015 project effort. Juliette is assisted by many, highly motivated volunteers. The 2014 show featured nearly 40 local and regional artists, exhibiting in a wide variety of visual arts. The 1st annual 2014 show, sponsored by Central School Project & The Mexican Consulate (Douglas), and in partnerships with Bisbee L.E.A.P. , and the Colegio Americano Anais (Agua Prieta, Sonora, Mexico) was well attended, and received. The key audience is Bisbee residents, visitors, and tourists. We will also target other Southern Arizona residents (Douglas, Sierra Vista, Willcox, Sonoita, Whetstone, Patagonia, etc.), with outreach via local artist/organizational contacts, newspapers, and social media. The secondary audience is Arizona residents in the greater Tucson area, and our nearby, south of the border neighbors in Sonora, Mexico. A tertiary, but lesser audience, is the remainder of Arizona residents, and tourists visiting Cochise, Santa Cruz, Graham, and Pima Counties. We feel confident that this event will gain momentum with each passing year, and we will be able to run this annual project indefinitely. We will continue to build additional partnerships within the community to provide sources of in kind gifts/services, and diversify our sources of funding. Thank you for your consideration.





Los Desconocidos and The Migrant Quilt Project was founded in Tucson by a group of volunteers who work arduously to sustain the lives of migrants who cross the border with little water, food or aid in the Sonoran Desert. We are an organization of like minded environmentalist, humanitarians, social justice advocates, artists, quilters and individuals who care deeply about the injustice of migration in a global economy.

Since late 2007, the group has cleaned up numerous lay-up sites, where migrants leave behind all their possessions, e.g. backpacks, clothes, photos, bibles and other bits and pieces of their belongings, before they continue onto their next leg of their journey. These campsites are scattered throughout the vast deserts between California and Texas all along the US/Mexico border. Los Desconocidos recycles the items such as water bottles, plastic bags, food containers, clothing, shoes and socks.


Many volunteers clean the desert while other volunteers embroider quilts for The Migrant Quilt Project.

Biography

Bobby Neel Adams was born in Black Mountain, North Carolina and presently resides in Bisbee, Arizona on the Mexico Border where he recently opened Little Yellow Cake Gallery. Adams has exhibited worldwide and his photographs are in the permanent collections of: International Center for Photography, Houston Museum of Fine Arts, Station Museum, diRosa Foundation, and the Norton Family Foundation to name a few. He has also received grants and awards from the Aaron Siskind Foundation, LEF Foundation, MacDowell Art Colony and the Hermitage. His book *Broken Wings* was published by the Greenville Museum in 1997. Adams is currently working on a series of Memento Mori photographs of insects, birds, and mammals. These photographs pay homage to the many species that have been pushed to the margins by the expanding human population.

To make these still life photographs Adams uses various mammals, insects and birds and arranges them with local vegetation of the region before either scanning or photographing them.

The Greenway Project

Adams proposes to collaborate with Greenway Elementary School's Art Students to make scanned still life photographs using various plant and animal life that the students gather and bring to class. This project is cross-curriculum, tying the natural sciences, technology, and art together in a single hands-on workshop environment.

- Adams will introduce the students to still life Vanitas paintings and then to his more contemporary photographic take on this Flemish painting movement.
- The students will team up in groups of three to collect organic material for making still life photographs.
- Adams will collaborate with these teams to compose this material either on the scanner or on a tabletop for photographing. The students will learn the following: How to operate a scanner, make light readings, manually operate a digital camera, compose a compelling photograph, and learn how to tweak image until it works.
- Adams recently opened Little Yellow Cake Gallery on Main Street in Old Bisbee. The project will culminate in a one-month exhibition of the student's photographs with a opening in the gallery.

Adams has secured the blessing of Greenway's principal Tad Bloss and its art instructor Craig Bowie for implementing this project in the school's art department should a grant
